PRESENT: Pat Leach, Chair; Bruce Boyd, Vice-Chair; Marilyn Mociun, Treasurer; Durinda Kelley; Ed Beckenbach; Jason Flores, Chief; Tracy Corris, District Manager; Kelly Moreno, District Secretary

- 1. CALL TO ORDER: Meeting called to order at 7:01 PM. Roll taken. All members present. Quorum established. Pledge of Allegiance.
- 2. PUBLIC COMMENT: There were no public comments.
- 3. CONSENT CALENDAR:
 - A. Pat called for any edits or discrepancies identified in last month's Board Meeting minutes. None were voiced. Ed Beckenbach moved to approve the March 24, 2015 minutes as presented, Durinda Kelly seconded, motion passed by unanimous vote.

4. ANNOUNCEMENTS:

- i. Durinda Kelley asked if anyone in the Department notices anything that needs to be done at the school at Shady Creek to please let her know.
- ii. Bruce Boyd shared information received from a fire behavior exhibit; succulents and other cactus are very good to plant around your house, whereas, shrubs against buildings are sources of ignition.
- iii. Pat Leach encouraged volunteering for Red Cross. Ned Russell needs volunteers for the Nevada County regional office.
- iv. Boomer Sicilini a volunteer at Graniteville has expressed an interest in joining us for Wednesday training sessions.

5. REPORTS:

- A. Chief's Report- Jason Flores:
 - i. Chief Flores reported on the eye injury obtained by firefighter Olson. The outcome was good, no long term issues. It was taken care of quickly and the Workers' Comp. paperwork was completed in a timely manner.
 - ii. The ISO review went smoothly. Chief Flores expressed appreciation to BC Tom Browning, BC Boyd Johnson, Kelly Moreno, and Tracy Corris for their preparation assistance. He feels confident that we will be able to maintain our 8B ISO rating and hopeful that we can get an increased (split) rating for the Ananda community.
 - iii. BC Boyd Johnson met with the Camptonville Fire Board about the possibility of a joint use agreement including equipment and firefighters. Chief Flores encouraged our Board members to reach out to the Camptonville Fire Chief

- and Board about opportunities to team up. Bruce Boyd volunteered to make that connection.
- iv. Chief Flores will attend a meeting of the Yuba River Fire Chiefs, to review annual agreements. He welcomed the Board to join him at this meeting.
- v. While there is no Advanced EMT training program in the region (yet), we are pursuing other possibilities in this direction. We submitted an application to provide EMT optional skills, Intranasal Narcan and Injectable Epinephrine. CPAP use is currently in place. There is potential to have advanced EMT services available by mid-summer. We will continue making improvements while we await the availability of a formal Advanced EMT program.
- vi. We continue to see volunteer interest. Last month five new recruits were introduced to the Board. This month we have a local woman entering the Rookie Class training program.
- vii. Pack Test Wildland Training is currently in progress.
- viii. We have acquired and issued new apparel to firefighters. This was made possible by a Cal Fire Grant we received.
- ix. Wildland fire season is in full swing. Burn permits will be required beginning May 1, 2015. The #1 cause of fires is abandoned campfires (human cause)/ lightning strikes (natural cause).
- x. In March we responded to 27 calls/incidents totaling 3,000 hours, with an average 4.5 firefighters per call. Fire numbers are increasing, although, medical calls remain our primary response.
- B. Treasurer's Report- Marilyn Mociun
 - i. Donations We received donations in the amount of \$80 during the period of 3/20/2015 to 04/20/2015.
 - ii. March 2015 Financials Cash disbursement, and fund balance reports were provided.

There were no questions or additional clarification needed. Bruce Boyd moved to approve the March 2015 disbursements, Pat Leach seconded, motion approved by unanimous vote.

- C. District Manager Report Tracy Corris
 - Currently we share a T1 line with Mother Truckers. At times we are competing for bandwidth, typically on their ordering days and the days when we process payroll. This is problematic when it occurs concurrently. No immediate change is necessary.
 - ii. We have a small infestation of termites in the pump house at Station 3. Terminex came out and did a full inspection. Repairs are currently taking place.

- iii. Tracy attended an ethics/harassment training and found it well worth the time spent.
- iv. We reached out to Higgins Fire Dept. to offer guidance as they are currently going through SCI.
- v. There is a concern about the portion of land that we use for the CalStar landing area. This is part of a parcel currently listed for sale. BC Boyd Johnson offered to call the family to see about the possibility having it donated to NSJFPD.
- vi. We are wrapping up our first paid call to include Measure Q funds. The District liability tax is unknown until payroll is complete.

D. Firefighter Association Report – Shawn Olson

- We held an outreach program at Grizzly Hill School on April 9th where we covered fire safety information, 911, and stop/drop/roll. It was a fun and successful event. The kids will follow up with a field trip to Station 3 on May 21st.
- ii. The lifejacket giveaway was slow on the first day so we carried it over to a second day, which was much busier. We are considering a third date to be held in the summer. In order to do this we will need donations in the form of money or lifejackets, as our supply of lifejackets is running low. The pizza restaurant in North San Juan may be interested in partnering in this project. The FFA would like to bring a truck out to this event, which Chief Flores authorized.
- iii. It was an eventful month in regard to call detail. Firefighters responded to a motorcycle accident, a fire, a river rescue involving a hike-in/helicopter flyout, and a motorcycle vs. deer collision.
- iv. The Spaghetti Dinner event was well attended, the auction was well received, and we raised approximately \$2,500.

E. PIO Report – Christoffer Montelius

- i. Last week was a busy week. We had mention in The Union, on YubaNet, and numerous postings on the San Juan Ridge Community Forum.
- ii. When we receive approval to provide 'EMT Optional Skills' we will provide press releases to media outlets. We will also provide general information about allergic reactions.
- iii. We would also like to send out a thank you, on behalf of the department and firefighters, to the community in gratitude for the additional funds provided by the passing of Measure Q.
- F. Fire Safe Council Report Durinda Kelley No meeting, nothing to report.
- G. LAFCO REPORT Ed Beckenbach
 - LAFCO presented a work plan for the upcoming year along with their budget. There is legislation in the works stating that if you want to contract with Cal Fire you must get union approval. LAFCO is against this legislation. Nick Wilcox, NID's representative, expressed distress over Governor Brown's water conservation plan specific to rural areas and noted that they are considering legal action. Next meeting date TBD.
- H. NCFA Report—Marilyn Mociun No meeting, nothing to report.
- I. Fire Auxiliary Report- Durinda Kelley

The Fire Auxiliary is in full swing in the planning of the Scotch Broom Breakfast. There will be more to report at next month's meeting.

6. NEW BUSINESS

A. NSJFPD Tax Report FY 2014/15 – Marilyn Mociun
 We received the Tax Report from SCI, which is an overview/summary of Measure
 Q. This report should be available to the public at the District Office, on our

website, and information posted on the San Juan Ridge Community Forum (Facebook). We should also send a copy to YubaNet.

- B. Approval of Resolution 2015-03 Measure Q Special Tax Report Approval Ed Beckenbach moved to approve as presented, Marilyn Mociun seconded, motion approved by unanimous vote. Ed requested that the Resolutions Table of Contents be updated and distributed to the Board.
- C. FDAC Conference Review Pat Leach
 Pat shared a PowerPoint presentation handout of *Board Roles and Responsibilities*.
 She will share more over time, and noted that:
 - SRA probably will not be repealed.
 - Cal Fire Reimbursement Portal to Portal, resolutions are needed.

Tracy reminded the Board that we have already approved a resolution for portal to portal pay. Pat requested that each Board member receive a copy of the PowerPoint presentation in its entirety.

- D. IIPP/Safety Plan Pat Leach
 The IIPP was last revised in 2003. We should review and distribute a new/revised edition. 'Back Issues', page 18-19 contains no descriptive information. Safety Officer is defined as the Fire Chief. It should indicate all three Chiefs' responsibility. So many things need doing and someone needs to make sure the detailed requirements are handled. Pat reiterated the importance of the Safety Plan and the Board's Responsibility for the safety of the community and employees of NSJFPD. Workers Comp. and accident investigation needs to be reviewed annually. We will have a copy of the IIPP available in the training room for reference. A Safety Committee will be established with Pat Leach and Ed Beckenbach representing the Board. Let it be known that the Board is taking this issue seriously.
- E. Website Update Marilyn Mociun
 We are currently working on updating content. A member of the community responded to a Facebook post calling for assistance. He provided some valuable information which we are building upon. Pascal from YubaNet has also offered assistance. This is a high priority and we are working to come up with a plan of action. Suggestions are welcomed.
- F. Newsletter Pat Leach
 The newsletter is printed. We are now ready to prepare for mailing. We will need volunteers to assist with this process.

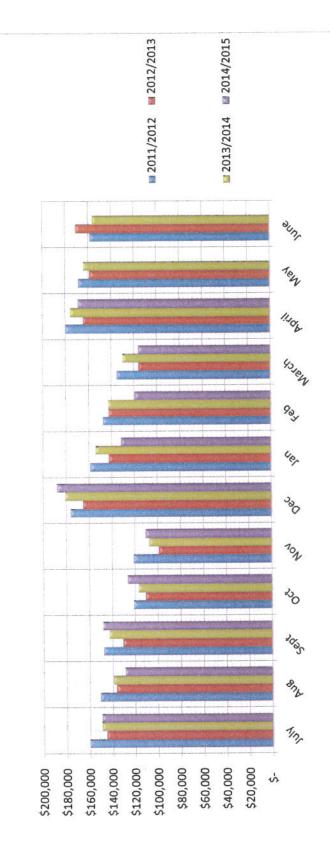

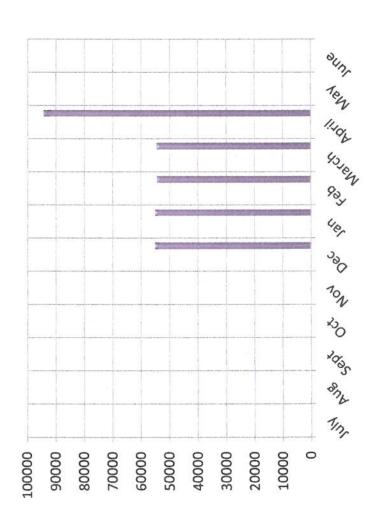
North San Juan Fire District Monthly Expenditures - General Fund
