Any person or group of persons acting in concert who directly or indirectly contribute \$1,000 or more in support of or in opposition to a change of organization or reorganization that has been submitted to Plumas LAFCO must comply with the disclosure requirements of the Political Reform Act of 1974 applicable to local initiative measures to be submitted to the electorate. These requirements contain provisions for making disclosures of contributions and expenditures at specified intervals; they may be reviewed at Government Code §§56700.1 and 81000 et seq. Additional information about the requirements pertaining to local initiative measures to be presented to the electorate can be obtained by calling the Fair Political Practices Commission at (916) 322-5660.

A LAFCO Commissioner must disqualify herself or himself from voting on an application involving an "entitlement for use" (such as an annexation or sphere amendment) if, within the last twelve months, the Commissioner has received \$250 or more in campaign contributions from the applicant, any financially interested person who actively supports or opposes the application, or an agency (such as an attorney, engineer, or planning consultant) representing the applicant or an interested party. The law (Government Code Section 84308) also requires any applicant or other participant in a LAFCO proceeding to disclose the contribution amount and name of the recipient Commissioner on the official record of the proceeding.

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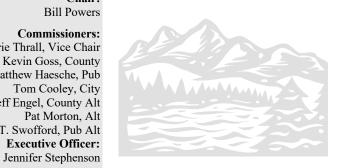

SUBJECT: MSR and SOI Status – FY 21-22 Workplan

At present, there are 53 special districts and one city under the jurisdiction of Plumas LAFCo. Municipal Service Reviews (MSRs) have been completed by region for the agencies beginning in 2011. The only agencies that remain without adopted MSRs are the Feather River Resource Conservation District (FRRCD) and the Plumas County Flood Control and Water Conservation District (PCFCWCD). FRRCD was included in a the MSR report adopted in 2017; however, it appears that the chapter was excluded from the adopted report. The chapter is in the process of being updated in conjunction with district staff for review and readoption by the Commission. There continues to be a need to formalize the exemption of PCFCWCD from LAFCo jurisdiction at the County level. Staff will work with County staff to complete that process.

According to Government Code §56425 (g), the Commission must every five years, or as necessary, review and update each sphere of influence (SOI). SOIs have been adopted or confirmed for a majority of the agencies; there are 9 districts and the City of Portola that remain in need of SOI updates.

Given the importance of MSRs to inform SOI updates and the role of MSRs in identifying any issues of concern and ensuring adequate service levels, it is paramount to continue the process of conducting MSRs for those agencies that are most in need. The MSR workplan for FY 21-22 is best informed by identifying those agencies with a particular need for detailed review.

Recommendation: Provide input regarding any districts of note that may benefit from the MSR process.
